### A Message from the President

Even though the summer season has winded down and excitement for fall is growing, we've enjoyed every minute of the last few months at Saint Mary's! You'll see what I mean in the following pages as we reflect on all the fun we've had over summer.

Earlier this year we kicked off a major construction project. Site work on the Carriage Home expansion project is underway and construction of the eight new homes should begin soon. This expansion will help create some movement for those on our wait-list who have been patiently waiting for a home.

In other construction news, we've been paying close attention to the needs of today's seniors and are making plans to renovate and convert some of our existing Residential Living apartments into two-bedroom apartments with two bathrooms and a full kitchen. With more couples aging together and lifestyle being a key decision factor for seniors, we're excited to offer another senior living option. More to come on that over the next few months.

This summer the Pennsylvania General Assembly approved the first funding increase in nearly a decade within the 2022-23 state budget for Medicaid nursing home care. Additional funding through the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) was also approved for COVID-19 relief assistance to nursing homes, personal care homes and other long-term care communities. This is promising news for seniors and providers, who have been fighting for more funding for a longtime.

Not too long ago Saint Mary's held our largest fundraising event of the year, Saint Mary's Follies. It was a fantastic night and we are deeply grateful for all those who supported the event and helped raise nearly \$100,000. The stories of the Ageless Remarkable Erieites always leave me inspired by the love they have for giving and volunteering.

Those two things, giving and volunteering, are something we are all capable of in some manner. If you're looking for ways to make a difference, perhaps you'll consider the impact you can have on Saint Mary's. Whether it's making a donation in support of our mission or giving your free time to us every so often by becoming a volunteer, we are grateful for all the different ways you support our community and our residents!

Saint Mary's is excited to announce we have selected 360Care as an ancillary provider for Dental, Vision and Audiology services for our long-term care residents and those living in Residential Living. 360Care brings these services directly to the facility and provides them on-site, eliminating the need for the resident to go out to an appointment. This saves time, makes access to care easier, and ensures that residents needs are met by providing preventative treatment.

### **Optometry**

Diagnose and treat eye disease and discomfort through eye exams, eye glasses ordering, fitting & adjusting, diabetic evaluations



### **Dental**

Professional dental care including exams, cleanings, diagnostic x-rays, fillings, dentures (new or replacement)

Hearing testing, Hearing Aid fitting & repairs, assistive listening devices, Removal of cerumen (earwax)

**360Care also offers an insurance program** that offers additional care, products and services at a reasonable monthly rate. For our Medicare residents, there is no additional cost for the insurance.

All clinical teams providing patient services have received specialized training specific to the residents of senior care communities. Temporary clinics are established on-site and treatment is provided using advanced equipment specifically selected for our residents. Detailed treatment notes are provided to keep the community staff informed and compliance needs met. A Patient Portal is available to residents, families and the facilities as well.

## Carriage Home Expansion

### Saint Mary's breaks ground on construction of eight new homes

Saint Mary's Home of Erie officially broke ground on the expansion of the Carriage Homes at Asbury Ridge in Millcreek Township on May 11, 2022. The Board of Trustees approved the addition of eight new Carriage Homes to help combat the demand and waitlist of the current 26 homes.

"We have a large number of people on a waiting list, wanting a home," stated Allen Bonace, President/CEO of Saint Mary's. "These eight additional homes will help meet the needs of seniors who still want an independent lifestyle but who also want to be part of a retirement community."

In 2006, Saint Mary's Leadership debuted the idea of the Carriage Homes to extend the continuum of care offered at Saint Mary's. The independent living homes help begin the transition into the CCRC lifestyle, offering residents a supportive community of neighbors who value their independence yet want the ease of maintenance-free living and priority access to more support as they age.



The eight new homes will be built in one of the three model designs that already exist on campus. These models, known as The Derby, The Preakness and The Belmont, range in size from 1,440 to more than 1,950 square feet of living space. Every home features a spacious living area, a four-season sunroom, an attached two car garage, a master bedroom with a walk-in closet and bathroom suite, a guest bedroom and a full bathroom, and ample closet and storage space. Carriage Home residents also have use of campus amenities and activities as well as priority access to all of the services at Saint Mary's at Asbury Ridge.

"We're very excited to complete this project and to be able to offer this service to more seniors," Bonace said. "We want the community to know that Saint Mary's is expanding and that we are not going anywhere."

Site work has been ongoing since the groundbreaking in May, with official construction expected to begin this fall. The homes are expected to be completed next year.
